LET'S TALK ABOUT COVID DOGS

ccording to the Washington Post, millions of dogs were adopted during the Covid lockdown. People were working from home and the isolation drove them to seek out a furry companion to stave off the loneliness, or as a buddy for the whole family, a distraction from the stress of such a drastically changed world. Shelters emptied, rescues adopted many dogs out, breeders had months-long waiting lists for puppies. For a time, what all people in rescue hope for—more dogs adopted—was a dream come true. But even the best dreams can have a downside.

The costs of food and care rose. Getting appointments for preventative care like vaccinations became difficult, day-care and dogwalkers also had months-long waiting lists for clients. Reality began to sink in. Most people stuck it out, too committed to their dog to surrender them. Then Covid restrictions eased, offices reopened, travel resumed, and people realized they didn't know what to do with their dog. They hadn't done much training or socializing. They'd always been home with their dog, so it was a surprise when

ways been home with their dog, so it was a surprise when they left them home alone and returned to destruction. They couldn't get into daycare or if they could they discovered they couldn't afford it. Their lives had returned to normal, but they weren't equipped to teach their dog what that new normal looked like or how to cope with the change.

Thus began the waves of surrenders.

Shelters and rescues are inundated with dogs and Doberman Rescue Unlimited has not been spared. While we haven't received so many New Hampshire Dobermans, we have taken in many Dobermans from other states who are overrun. Currently, we're nearing our capacity, and we're con-

tinually approached about taking in more. Many of the dogs are only 1-2 years old, a few qualify as SSNAP dogs. Regardless of age or circumstances, DRU has stepped up to take as many as possible.


