Aria is our sixth Dobie rescue, and our fourth from DRU. Our previous rescues from DRU included Sirus, a lovable and sometimes stubborn 95-pound red male. Juniper, a mischievous little 55-pound red female from the infamous "J" litter. And most recently Petra, a sweet black and tan female who passed away last September, at II years old. She was a sweetheart that we miss very much.

On Valentine's Day this year, Aria found her forever home with us! She is a beautiful 2-year-old red female that we are told was made homeless by the California fires. She still is just a big puppy at heart, fetching, playing tug and simply loves playing "catch me" with our other dog Moxie. Her puppy play is very much magnified by her near adult size of 62 pounds. This makes it super important to place oneself out of the line of fire or risk being bulldozed over by this big very playful pup. Believe me, I have a few bruises to show from foolishly getting in the way of some of those playful moments. But her playfulness really helps her in getting acquainted with other dogs and simply makes her super entertaining to have around us.



Offen, she will greet you with a tennis ball in her mouth, hoping that you're up for a game of fetch with her. Fetch is her absolute favorite game. It is also a great way to burn off that playful energy and create some quite nap time afterwards.

Aria is settling in super-fast. She was housebroken in a few days. She came with all the "software." By that I mean she was previously obedience trained and knew all her commands, i.e., come, sit, stay, down, out, up, "give me five" and knew her name very well. This made things so easy for her introduction into our household. She wants very much to please and is VERY food motivated, making training her new things fun and super easy.

Our beagle Moxie is still a bit put off sometimes by the high intensity that Aria puts into her playfulness. But each day Moxie finds new ways to play with Aria and we are sure they will become close in the coming days.

My son Phil and I feel so blessed to have rescued Aria. Having Aria has already made our household so much more fun and enjoyable. The added play and the fun of just watching her explore her new world enriches our lives in ways we cannot measure. The DRU shelter has been the refuge and sanctuary for thousands of Dobermans since it was built over 20 years ago. Young and old, sick and well, none are turned away. We have taken in Dobermans in need from our primary service area of New England and New York/New Jersey, and also from many other areas of the United States; we've even taken in Dobes from places like Egypt, Kuwait, Puerto Rico, and Mexico. We will care for any Doberman in need that can get to us and we will care for them until their new adoptive families can be found.

DRU is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation that relies solely on membership dues, donations and fund-raising activities for its income. You can become a member or get involved.
